**List of Services and Operating Expenses Covered by Facility Fee's**

Facility fees generally cover a range of services and operating expenses associated with hospital operations. The following is a summary of these items and is not intended to be an exhaustive list.

**Services:** Facility fees help fund the infrastructure and support systems necessary to deliver care such as:

- Emergency Services
  - 24/7 availability of emergency department.
  - On-call medical staff and rapid response systems.
- Nursing and Support Staff
  - Salaries and benefits for nurses, technicians, and administrative personnel.
  - Staff training and compliance with regulatory standards.
- Medical Equipment and Technology
  - Purchase, maintenance, and upgrades of diagnostic and treatment equipment.
  - IT systems for electronic health records and patient monitoring.
- Drug Therapies and Supplies
  - Stocking and managing pharmaceuticals and medical supplies.
  - Safe storage and handling of medications.
- Integrated Care Coordination
  - Systems for transferring patients between departments or facilities.
  - Coordination between outpatient clinics and hospital departments.

**Operating Expenses:** Facility fees also support the broader operational costs of running a hospital or hospital-owned clinic:

- Building and Infrastructure
  - Rent, bond repayments, and/or depreciation of hospital buildings.
  - Renovations and facility upgrades.
- Utilities and Maintenance
  - Electricity, water, heating/cooling, and waste management.
  - Janitorial services and building repairs.
- Security and Safety
  - Security personnel and surveillance systems.
  - Fire safety and emergency preparedness.
- Regulatory Compliance
  - Meeting federal and state healthcare regulations.
  - Accreditation and quality assurance programs.
- Administrative Overhead
  - Billing, scheduling, and patient records management.
  - Legal, HR, and finance departments.
